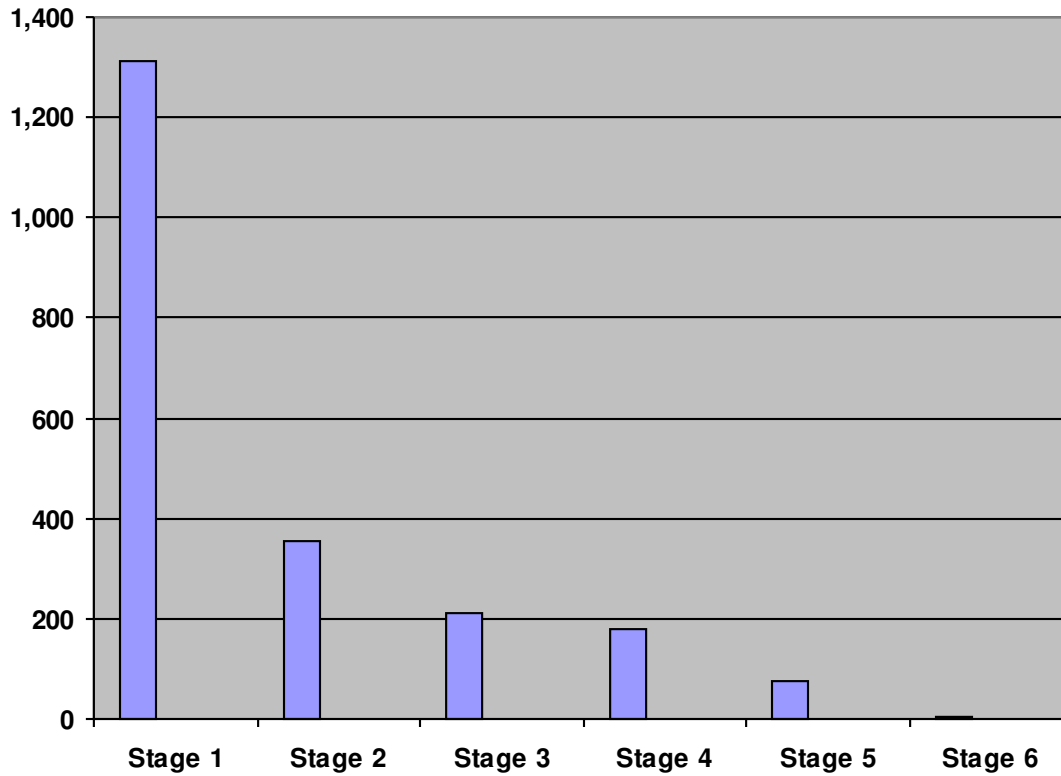


Figure 1: Filtering of Cases Through Maryland's Death Penalty System: 1978 - 1999

Stage 2: Notification to Seek Death (N = 353) 27% of all death eligible crimes

Stage 3: Death Notification not Retracted (N = 213)

Stage 4: Case Advanced to a Penalty Trial (N = 180)

Stage 5: Imposition of a Death Sentence (N = 76) 42% of penalty trials; 6% of all death eligible crimes

Stage 6: Execution (N = 5)

Figure 2: Filtering of Cases Through Maryland's Death Penalty System by Offender's Race

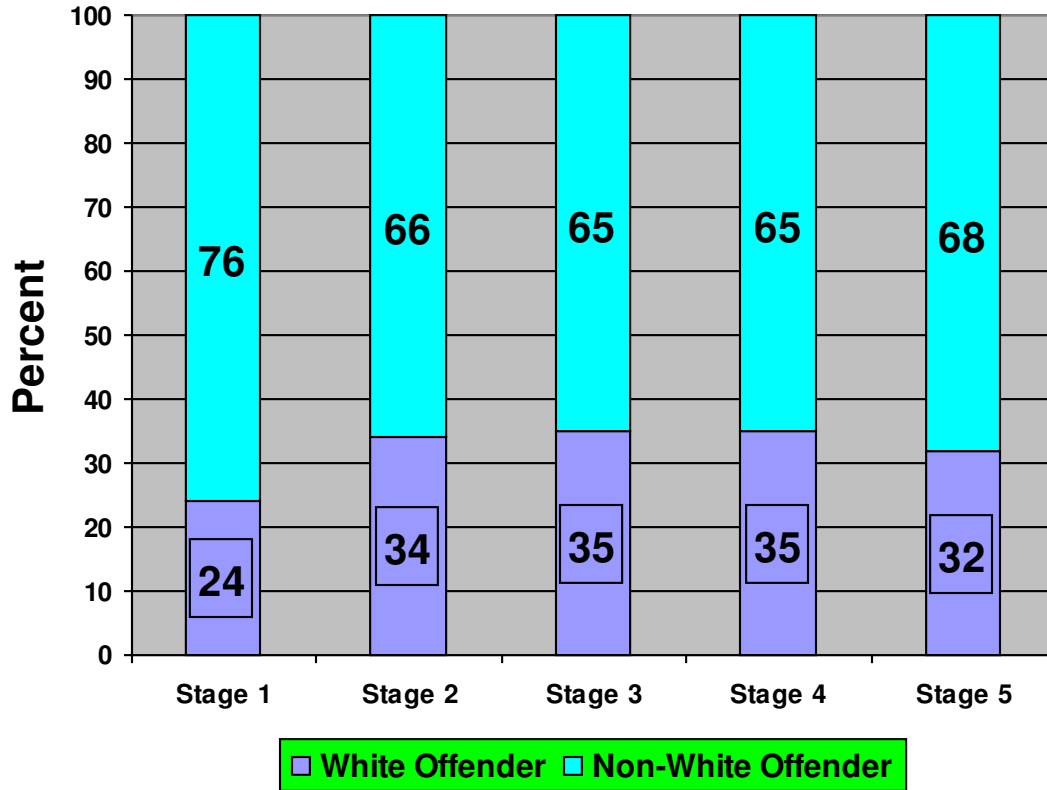


Figure 3: Filtering of Cases Through Maryland's Death Penalty System by Victim's Race

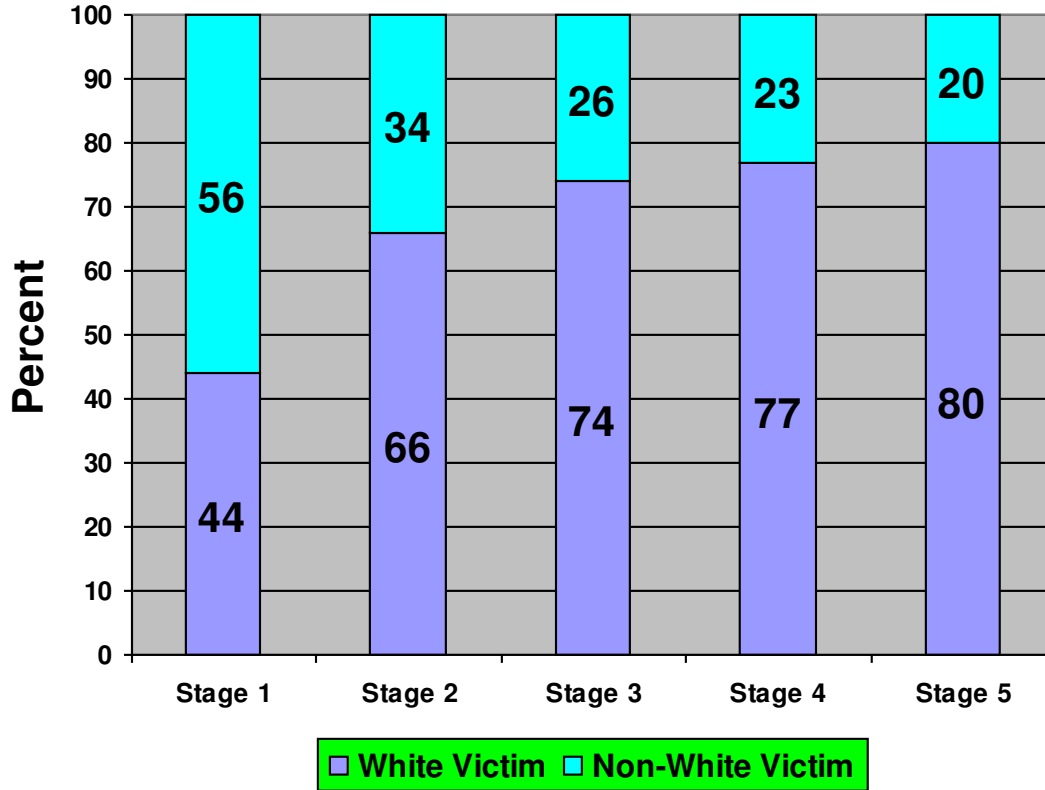


Figure 4: Filtering of Cases Through Maryland's Death Penalty System by Offender and Victim's Race

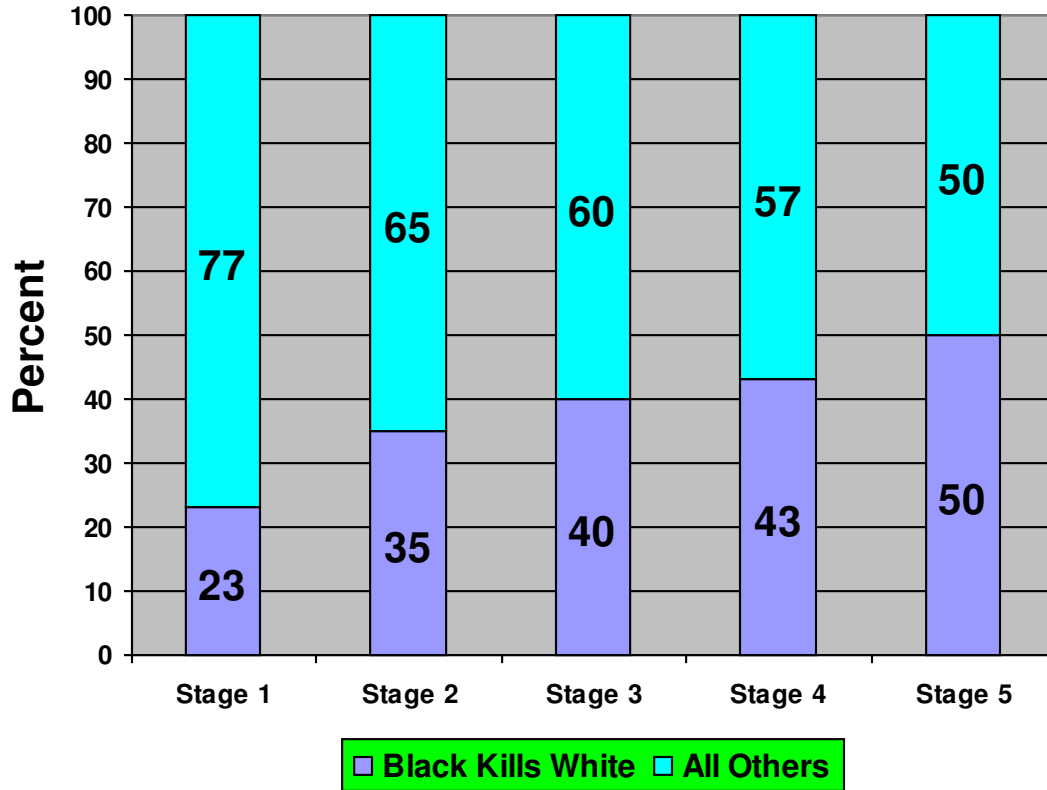


Figure 5: Filtering of Cases Through Maryland's Death Penalty System by Jurisdiction

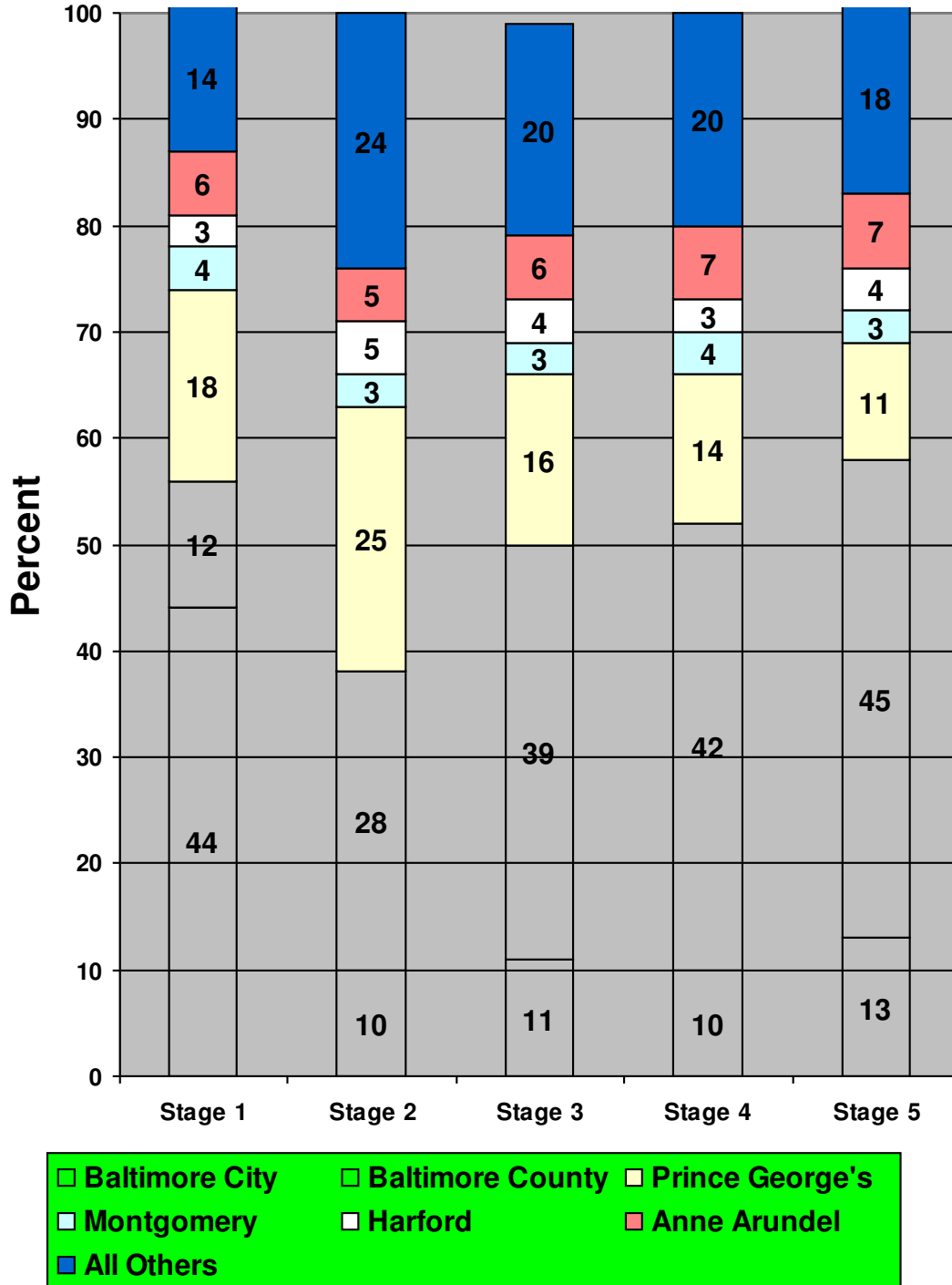
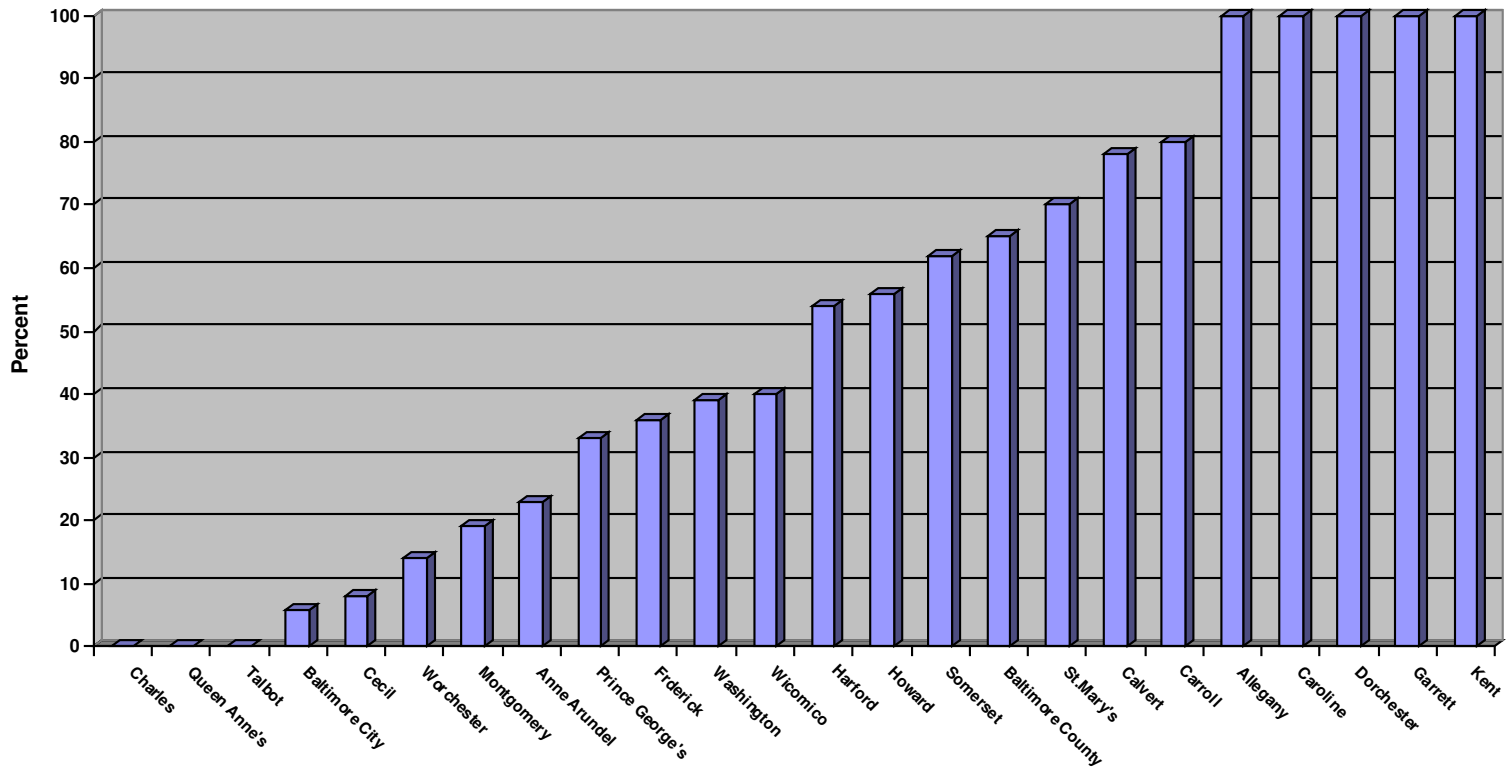


Figure 6: Percent of Death Eligible Homicides in Maryland Counties Resulting In A Death Request - 1978-1999

INFORMATION ON CASE CHARACTERISTICS COLLECTED IN THE STUDY OF THE MARYLAND DEATH
PENALTY SYSTEM

1. Number of prior violent felony convictions (0,1,2,3+)
2. Multiple victim case
3. Any of the victims a stranger to defendant
4. Any of the victims has a criminal history
5. Defendant has a history of alcohol abuse
6. Defendant has a history of drug abuse
7. Defendant has history of mental illness/emotional problems
8. Defendant under age 21 at time of offense
9. Defendant over age 60
10. Defendant unable to control conduct due to alcohol/drugs

37. Defendant actively evaded arrest

39. Defendant escaped from custody

41. Defendant interfered with judicial process
42. Defendant has previously threatened/attempted to kill victim
43. Defendant threatened victim in front of family
44. Defendant threatened other family members
45. Defendant threatened to kill victim in advance
46. Defendant abandoned victim who might otherwise have lived
47. Defendant persisted in attack even after death was certain
48. Defendant forced his/her way into place of murder of any of the victims
49. Weapon brought to the murder scene of any of the victims
50. Any of the victims killed with a bizarre or unusual weapon
51. Any of the victims forced to beg/plead for their lives
52. Any of the victims' murder planned for more than five minutes

Mean/Proportion

113. Victim was a law enforcement officer
114. Murder committed while defendant was in an institution
115. Murder committed in effort to evade capture by authorities
116. Murder committed in course of kidnapping
117. Victim was a child under the age of 12
118. Defendant carried out a contract killing
119. Defendant solicited killing
120. Defendant was serving a sentence of life imprisonment or death
121. Multiple victim murder
122. Murder committed along with carjacking/robbery/rape/arson

- Ratio of black kills white to black kills black = 2.4 to 1
- Ratio of black kills white to white kills white = 1.8 to 1

Probability of Death Sentence

- Ratio of black kills white to black kills black = 3.4 to 1
- Ratio of black kills white to white kills white = 2.4 to 1

- Ratio of Baltimore County to Baltimore City = 13.5 to 1
- Ratio of Baltimore County to Montgomery County = 5.3 to 1
- Ratio of Baltimore County to Prince George's County = 1.63 to 1
- Ratio of Harford County to Baltimore City = 10.9 to 1
- Ratio of Harford County to Montgomery County = 4.3 to 1

Probability of Death Sentence

- Ratio of Baltimore County to Baltimore City = 22.8 to 1
- Ratio of Baltimore County to Montgomery County = 13.7 to 1
- Ratio of Baltimore County to Prince George's County = 8.1 to 1
- Ratio of Harford County to Baltimore City = 7.5 to 1
- Ratio of Harford County to Montgomery County = 4.5 to 1
